DEAR FRIENDS,

We want you to have the best festival camping experience of your life at our Crawfish Fest. We would like to familiarize you with the special perks and FAQ's of being a Crawfish Fest Camper.

Matt Cavanaugh is your full time Camping Director. He can be found on a golf cart zooming around or just ask anyone with a walki-talkie to help you if you need assistance.

You will be able to walk back and forth from the campground to the festival all day long. Food and drinks can be brought into the campground from the festival, but no food or drinks may be brought into the festival area except sealed water bottles. If you attempt to bring in food or drinks into the festival grounds, you will be stopped by security. Camping wristbands are required for campground access at all times, which includes festival admission for Friday, Saturday and Sunday shows. Absolutely no guests or visitors will be allowed in the campgrounds without a camping wristband. We will provide ice stations – one will be in between Camp New Orleans and Camp Baton Rouge and one in Camp Madisonville. Ice will be available in 20# bags for \$5 on Saturday and Sunday between 9:00 AM – 9:30 AM, 1:00 PM – 2:00 PM and 7:00 PM – 7:30 PM. For Friday, ice will be available from 6:30 PM – 7:30 PM.

Where can I keep my car?

For your convenience, your vehicle may be parked near your site. After that, however, for everybody's safety, it may not be moved until you leave. If you will not be staying for the duration, or expect to use your car during the weekend, you will need to park outside of the camping area.

Will there be food for sale for the campers?

We will cook Jambalaya on Friday night to be served free around 5 PM at the Jambalaya Booth. The Bayou Bar next to the Pavilion Stage will open on Friday at 5 PM. On Saturday and Sunday, Scrambled Eggs, Beignets, Coffee, Fruit Cups and Crab Cake Eggs Benedict will be available from 7 AM till 10 AM in the food court and near the Pavilion Stage.

What's the campground schedule?

The campground will be open for arrivals on Friday, May 31st, from 10 AM until 9 PM, and again on Saturday, June 1st, from 8 AM until 11 AM. Campers arriving between load-in times will have the choice of carrying their things in, or waiting for vehicle access. All campers must leave by noon on Monday.

Will we be able to cook?

Yes, but not on an open campfire. Small pit or wood fires are permitted, but they must be 12 inches above the ground. You must have an ABC fire extinguisher readily available near your fire. You should bring your

own food and beverages (but no glass, please), as well as an ice chest. Keep all food tightly stored in your cooler, secure in a vehicle (not in your tent), and maintain a safe and sanitary site. Food and beverages from the campground are NOT permitted in the concert area at any time including Friday night. Only sealed water bottles will be permitted. You will be stopped by security and this will be enforced. Any cooking oil should be put in a container. Let us know if you need us to dispose of it or take it home.

Can I sell food/drink/jewelry/clothes/etc.?

No vending is permitted in the campgrounds. You will be asked to leave. No Refunds. Also no fliers, magazines, CD's or handbill distribution allowed.

Will we be able to jam?

Certainly! We welcome acoustic instruments and all styles of music. We do ask, however, that you respect your neighbors and the 10 PM sound curfew.

What's The Grove?

The Grove is to the right of the main stage, thru the double gates of the main concert field. Tents on the main field can not be set up until the main gates open. Campers will be able to set up day tents in The Grove on the other side of the fence on Saturday Morning as early as 9 AM. Single Day Ticket holders are welcome to visit and set up in the Grove. No Commercial signage on tents and no tents larger than 10 x 10 and no sides. Tents MUST be staked down when unattended. We can't wake up Sunday and have a cluster of Tents if we get some wind. No over-nite camping in these tents. This area will be fenced and you can enter by walking thru the main concert field or from Camp Lafayette. Tents can be left up Saturday night in the Grove only and must be picked up Sunday Night. Tents may not be left up over night in front of the Main Stage.

What should I leave at home?

Pets, kegs, glass jars and bottles, and, of course, anything else you shouldn't have to begin with (fireworks, weapons, other illicit/illegal substances, etc.). No golf carts, ATVs (all-terrain vehicles), motorized scooters, skateboards, bicycles. Motorcycles may not be driven from the camping area into the festival area. No Emotional Support pets. Trained Service animals only. Please don't bring so much that you can't leave your site as clean as you found it.

What if I have special needs or circumstances?

We want to make this your annual camping event, one that's enjoyable for everybody, so we'll do what we can. Let us know in advance if you foresee a problem or have additional questions.

Anything else I should worry about?

Probably not. Fine Print: Management reserves the right to search tents and vehicles, and to evict anyone behaving inappropriately or stupid.

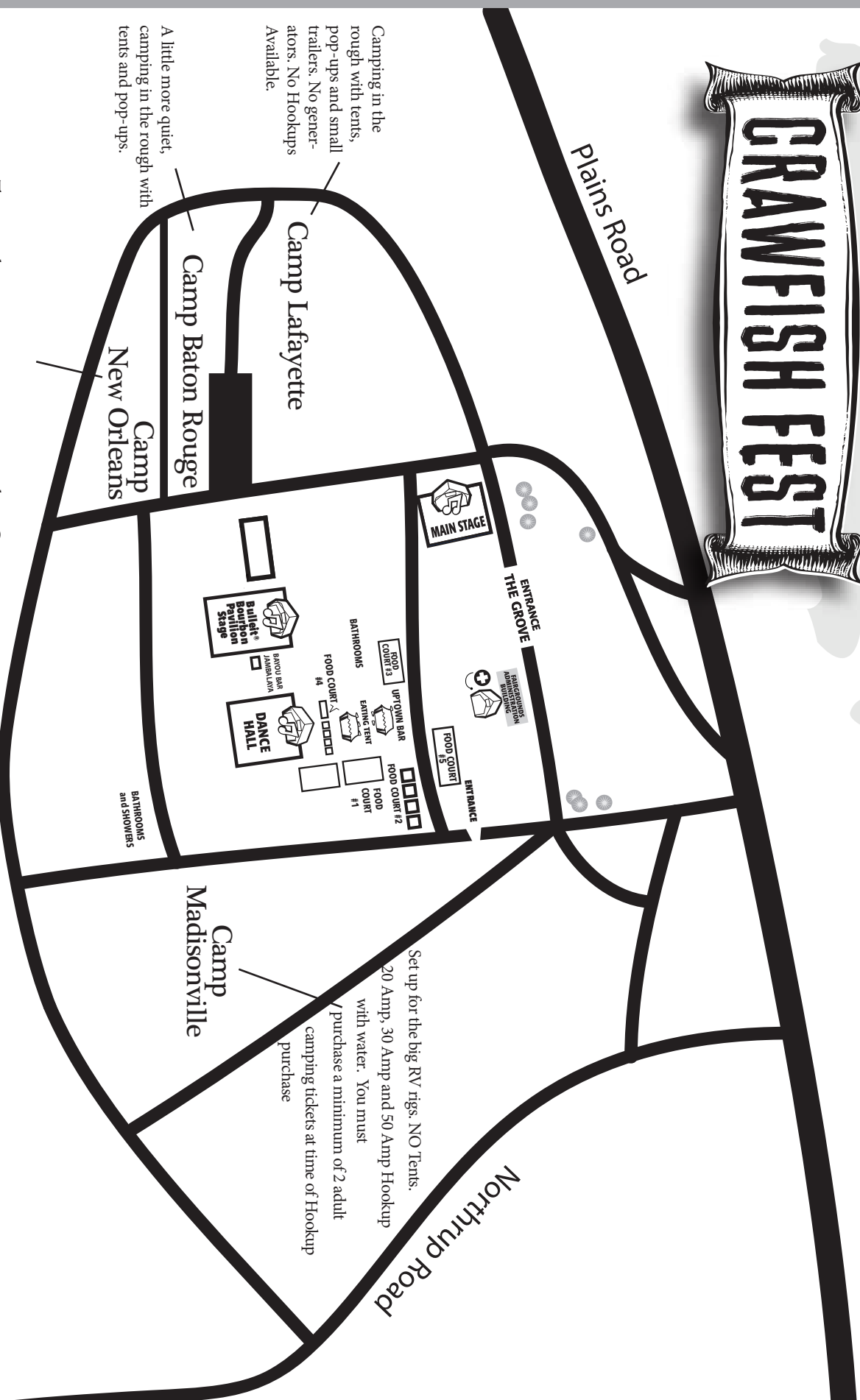
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Camping tickets are required for each person camping
